Draft Mission Action Plan

A mission action plan gives direction on the particular mission of a ministry unit within the broader mission of the Church, which participates in the mission of God to the world. There are approximately 300 churches in Christchurch. They all embody in some way parts of God's mission in this city. We are seeking to discern what the particular mission of St Paul's Papanui is at this time. We want to explore how this Church can help people to meet God, to make friends and to grow in faith. Who and how can we serve in ways that other parts of the Universal Church cannot serve that well?

This church has many strengths that we are called to use. We have a heritage building that is a landmark in the local community, is situated in a beautiful graveyard, and is easily reached by different transport modes. We are well connected to several community groups. As a small church, we provide a welcoming community. Many of our parishioners are elderly, but talented and faithful.

We also face particular challenges. We are a fairly traditional church that may be perceived as boring, irrelevant and mono-cultural. The Parish has had a somewhat turbulent recent history. This also means that we are relatively few people and therefore have to be careful not to take on activities that would overload our volunteers. Like some other churches, we need to build up our knowledge of the Bible and our faith, and increase our focus on discipleship. We are called to be good stewards of what God has given us. This also means recognising the financial challenges and gifts.

The Vestry has considered our current times and proposed a Mission Action Plan that looks at initiatives in the next three years (<u>new initiatives</u> underlined and in italics). I commend that vision to you, to pray about it and to comment on it. We probably will try some things and find they may not succeed, and new unforeseen opportunities will open up. Through it all God will be with us. In addition, we need to discern the long-term direction of this Parish and consider how we might use this heritage in the Mission of God.
