It is not so much the case that God has a mission for his church in the world, as that God has a church for his mission in the world. Mission was not made for the church; the church was made for mission —God's mission. Chris Wright

A mission action plan gives direction on the particular mission of a ministry unit within the broader mission of the Church, which participates in the mission of God to the world. There are approximately 300 churches in Christchurch. They all embody in some way parts of God's mission in this city. St Paul's Papanui is part of God's mission and is offering its particular gifts to help people to meet God, to make friends and to grow in faith.

We have Jesus' commission to make disciples in all nations (Matthew 28:19). Discipleship, therefore, is a key aspect of the outworking of God's mission in the world. In the first letter to the Thessalonian church, Paul described the church there in terms of discipleship, encouraging them as they were faithful to their calling.

We continually remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labour prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Thessalonians 1:3 Work, faith, labour, love, endurance and hope are all connected together as Christians grow as disciples and also impact on the world. These cannot be seen separately. Simplifying the verse a little, we can see how faith flows over into love and together they inspire to good works, which again encourage hope and renewed faith. At the centre of all this is Jesus Christ.



Paul's word are first of all addressed to a church community. We are not disciples alone; we are not engaged in God's mission alone, but together, both through the people in this Parish and those in other churches. It is therefore important that we encourage each other and build each other up, while at the same time looking outwards to show God's love to those who we meet. This Mission Action Plan has come out of the consideration of the Vestry with further input by various parishioners. The Mission Action Plan looks at initiatives in the next three years (*new initiatives* underlined and in italics). We probably will try some things and find they may not succeed, and new unforeseen opportunities will open up. Through it all God will be with us.

Prayer for St Paul's Loving God, grow us into a community of grace in which the love and life of Christ are to be found. Through the Holy Spirit, may your abundant grace flow between us and out to the community and world around us. Through Jesus Christ our Saviour, Healer and Lord. Amen.
